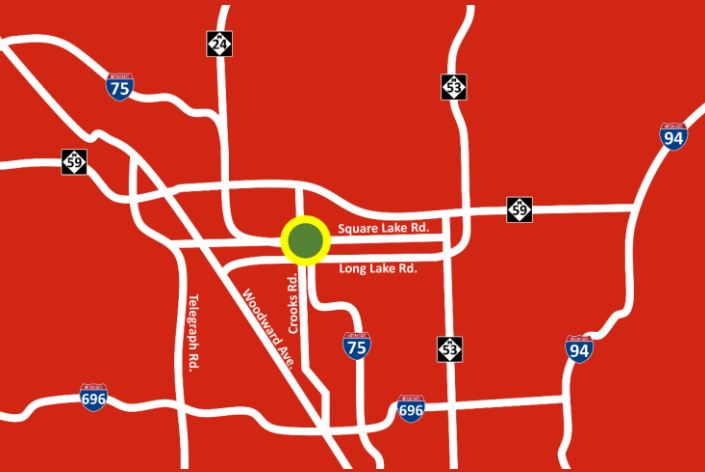

Melissa M. Novock is currently the Human Trafficking Specialist with WC SAFE (Wayne County Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner’s Program). Her history of working with survivors of human trafficking includes both Detroit and New York City. In New York, she worked for the Center for Court Innovation as the Prostitution Diversion Coordinator (in the Bronx) where she assisted with developing the Human Trafficking Court. She is also a member of the Joint Anti Trafficking Task Force (JATT). She has worked with victims/ survivors of intimate partner violence, sexual assault and human trafficking for over twenty years. The span and context of working with survivors includes the criminal justice system; the legal system, the medical/health care system and various not-for-profit organizations. She is a graduate of Saint Mary’s College, Notre Dame, and the University of Detroit Law School.
